Our Directors lead their respective portfolios with a minimum of fuss producing great outcomes for our club. Training, media, surf sports, nippers, patrols, member development, and our resources both physical and financial have continued to be well managed and developed.

Supporting our Directors in all they do are our hundreds of member volunteers who patrol the beaches, officiate at carnivals, coach and keep safe our nippers, maintain our equipment, help at social functions, sell apparel, cook BBQ's, train our competition teams etc etc. Your efforts are invaluable in making this club what it is. And that is a great community of which we are all valued.

As mentioned annually our core business of patrolling does not happen by itself. Our Patrol Captains and Vice Captains have been invaluable with their organisation and upskilling of their groups. Our Patrol structures, attendance and diligence has been outstanding, which is a testament to our Club Captain, Josephine McDowall. Jo has again been tireless in building patrols and the club is indebted to her longevity in the role. Jo is her tireless in her role as Club Captain and I wish to both acknowledge and thank Jho for her continued efforts this season. The club is very fortunate to have Josephine McDowall.

The annual necessary evil that is skills maintenance, thanks to Dean Kilpatrick, was as seamless as it's ever been. Dean and his team of trainers, including those from Brauer, Emmanuel and Warrnambool Colleges saw record numbers for our club assessed which was reflected in the huge numbers of active patrol members. Skilled members are the cornerstone in the delivery of our emergency service response. This skill base is due to Deans commitment to his role as Director – Training and we are indebted to him for his passion, thoroughness and knowledge.

Our competition squads continue to grow in numbers and skill. Dedication and hard work at training pays off and thus year our athletes have impressed across the competition spectrum. The coaches (Steve Kerr, Jackson Fary, Travis Madigan and John Cook) have been instrumental in the success and culture of the squads and are to be commended on their leadership. Regardless of competition results It makes me very proud to say that all our competitors are great ambassadors for our club. Of course, involvement in competition doesn't just happen. To our 'competition coordinators' (John Cook & Trav Madigan), Officials, IRB personnel, water safety and first aid crews – a big thank you for enabling our comp teams to participate in a sport they love.

To Clint Joseph our Director – Junior Activities, a huge thank you for another season of Nippers. For the last five years Clint had held this role, each year with excess of 220 nippers, with the success of this program being reflected in strengthening nipper transition into both our Cadets and Patrol groups. This season our nippers were again spoilt with the LSV Junior Lifesaving Championships being held on our home beach. This is the 10th consecutive year we have hosted a State

Championship on the March Labor Day Weekend. And again, I like to acknowledge Warrnambool City Council, The Lions Club of Warrnambool, Matt Wood and Al Aulsebrook for everything they do to continually make these Championships such a success.

This season saw us, via the efforts of James Kol, continue to build our social media profile and general presence in the community. These platforms have consolidated and strengthen our sponsor relationships to the point where many sponsors are committing to multiple year agreements. James's ability to utilise the capabilities and potential of social media has been of enormous benefit. Our online presence is the envy of many clubs and for our own members the constant updates on club events, nippers and carnivals has been integral in timely and appropriate information dissemination. I can't thank James enough for his work and commitment to the club as his skills are truly first class and we have been fortunate to have him.

As a club we are indebted to Liz Duncan and Clinton Hill for their valuable and significant assistance they have both provided to the finance and administration of our club. Our club continues to be financially sound, risk aware and both strategically and operationally well administered. So, on behalf of the whole membership, I would like to thank Liz and Clinton who have admirably served the club.

The events and social side of our club this season was all thanks to Jacinta Roache. Pink Patrol, Men's Patrol, Let's Talk Patrol, Solstice Swim were all very well supported and enjoyed by club members. LSV Leadership opportunities have been a focus for our emerging leaders this season and a big thank you must go to Jacinta for driving these leadership development opportunities.

I would like to thank the Redevelopment Committee for continued efforts on the future of the Warrnambool Surf Life Saving Club master plan. I've become less naïve about our political landscape and remain hopeful of a positive outcome with regards to our proposed new clubhouse.

In conclusion, I am proud to be a member of this club and to serve as its President. I am extremely grateful to my family, Will, Jack, Ruby, Molly and Leah for their patience and support. I am blessed to have great people around me and I am confident of continued vigilance and service.

CLUB CAPTAIN

Each season the level of commitment by our club volunteers continues to impress. We are so fortunate as a club to have a committed group of members as our patrol captains and vice captains and also the trainers and assessors who ensure that our lifesavers are ready for the season ahead.

This season we have worked on succession planning within our patrol groups. A number of experienced members are acting in a Vice-Captain capacity to enable other members to gain experience as captains. We are also continuing to encourage members via an incentives program to gain advanced lifesaving awards to boost patrol capacity and also to enable split shifts on patrols so the same members aren't always relied upon to be on duty. We have continued our after hours response group but refined the structure and operations. We also had three club members go and complete the new Silver Medallion Patrol Captain award (which replaces Beach Management). The new award is designed to better equip patrol captains to manage their team, assess risk, plan incident response and to gain skills to work better with other emergency service agencies. We plan to roll this new award out to members in the 23/24 season.

Lifeguard services at our beach now operate from early December to the end of February on weekdays and Saturday morning. This is a result of advocacy by our club over the past few years to increase this service in response to the large volume of tourists on our foreshore and wouldn't be possible without the support of Warrnambool City Council. The value of this service has been proven with an increased number of rescues on our beach, many of these carried out by our lifeguards on one day with particularly dangerous conditions.

I would like to extend a thank you to those members who responded to patrol text reminders, strove to keep their patrol commitments, helped organise subs when they couldn't attend, ensured they patrolled enough hours to meet competition requirements and who answered the call when we were short on numbers. To our patrol captains in particular – your role in chasing numbers, mentoring members and maintaining the quality of our patrol service is greatly appreciated.

Congratulations to our Lifesaver of the Year Jackson Fary.

Jacko in previous years was a Lifeguard on South West beaches and also in the UK. He has been instrumental in the encouragement of youth leadership in lifesaving and as a patrol captain and Director of Lifesaving he has been a mentor to other patrol captains and vice captains. He is a trainer/assessor in Bronze Medallion and IRB, a competitor and ski coach. Jacko also assists in patrol rostering, event water safety and equipment maintenance.

DIRECTOR - JUNIOR ACTIVITIES

A big thank you to our volunteers for your assistance throughout the 22/23 season including 50 volunteers at each nipper education session, 20 water safety / trainers at competition squad sessions, age managers and officials at competitions.

The commencement of our season was in doubt due to water quality issues from recent flood events and bay dredging. Through engagement with local authorities and water quality testing we were able confidentially return to the water, this was in comparison with bayside and surf coast areas that were not so lucky with delayed or beach only programs until their water returned to normal.

This year saw a number of changes made across nippers.

Our nipper education season schedule saw a change in format allowing our members to attend junior and senior competitions, swim and club events whilst also allowing a successful nipper education program to be run. A combination of mid-week, Friday evening and Saturday morning sessions were held with consistent numbers attending each of the 10 sessions offered concluding with club champs.

We saw the introduction of a three-day SRC training camp before Christmas that was well received by parents and trainers alike with 22 obtaining their SRC and joining patrols for the first time.

Another new was the introduction of Starfish nippers, an all ability / inclusive program with modified beach and water programs. Hard to say who gained the most satisfaction and enjoyment out of the program, the nippers themselves or the volunteers running the program.

Thank you to the volunteers taking on and supporting these new initiatives.

We saw approximately 210 nippers enrolled this year, down slightly on prior years but in turn providing more participation opportunities and time to learn new skills. Age managers reported increased attendance rates when compared to prior years. The change in format was well received, evident in feedback received by our end of season survey monkey questionnaire.

We saw the return (post covid) of the New Years Eve tin rattle through the caravan parks, highlighted by so many positive comments and compliments directed towards both the club and the nippers themselves including "thank you" & "you do a great job" from the holiday makers.

Our competition squad saw the return of approximately 58 nippers back in October for training. Our first carnival scheduled for Ocean Grove was relocated to Lorne due to the water quality emanating from the Barwon River. Carnivals following, we attended were Cosy Corner, Point Leo (qualifier) Anglesea and states at Warrnambool. Our athletes showed great dedication, sportsmanship and determination over the season with many great results not only at states but also the regional carnivals.

Thank you to the coaches, managers and volunteers, especially those undertaking additional training such as our new sport officials for the culture they maintain, making the competition season fun, inclusive and in turn successful.

The ongoing benefit of the competition squad coaches and trainers involved in our nipper education program has been noted by many including visiting LSV delegates. Benefits include increased adult

participation with an increasing number of parents gaining their bronze medallion boosting our water safety numbers, a sense of involvement and belonging and allowing more comprehensive teaching / training on the beach and in the water for an improved program and experience for our nippers.

As my final year in the nipper program concludes I take this opportunity thank everyone for your support and friendship especially over the last four years during my role as director.

DIRECTOR - LIFESAVING

It has been another fantastic and action packed season for Warrnambool Surf Life Saving Club. From volunteers assisting with flood relief in Northern Victoria for LSV and Water Police to patrolling, and conducting water safety for swim and surf carnivals, it has been a busy year for volunteers.

The gear inspection in October started went well and it was a good opportunity to donate old rescue boards to other organisation such as the Warrnambool Yacht Club to assist with their water safety during the summer and to audit the current quality of surf club equipment. John Whitson and Mike Vafiades (unsure how to spell Vav last night) in organising all IRB maintenance and ensuring there are operational IRBs during patrol and out of hours.

Before the season's commencement, multiple club members such as John Whitson, Mick Owen and Ben Pendleton assisted with the flood relief work. The assistance provided by Warrnambool and the entire LSV volunteers was greatly needed and appreciated by emergency services and the public affected by flooding.

The patrol season was a busy year with large numbers of visitors to Warrnambool post covid era which cause an action packed season with multiple rescues and preventative actions. The paid lifeguard services did a fantastic job patrolling Port Campbell, Warrnambool, Port Fairy and Narrawong during the peak season. It was the first time that extended patrols in Warrnambool occurred outside of the peak season. I would like to say thank you to Mick Owen and all paid lifeguards for the great work they do during the season to keep the patrol beaches safe.

The participation for board and ski training during last season was incredible and for the future, WSLSC has great young adults coming through the competition season and it is fantastic to see them putting the hours in patrol, and upskilling awards. It has been a record number in participation for ski paddling for many years and it is great to see a large number paddling with Ben Johnson in the river during the winter. I would like to say thanks to Steve Kerr and Ben Johnson for all the guidance and assistance in coaching.

The volunteer patrols were also kept very busy with rescues, missing people, major first aid incidents and patrolling the water. I would like to say thank you to all Patrol Captains and everyone who participated in patrols this season, it was a busy year and all your time spent down patrolling, preparation with patrol, training new and upskilling members. Warrnambool Surf Life Saving Club is in a great position with members helping and mentoring the upcoming lifesavers.

DIRECTOR - MEDIA AND COMMUNICATIONS

The Warrnambool Surf Life Saving Club has continued to progress into the 21st century using a mix of digital and traditional media channels designed to promote the social and community aspects of the club and to encourage members, old and new, to make and build friendships and connections. This year an effort has been made to use technology that would allow the club to not only reduce the administrational workload but deliver new opportunities through sponsorship and to engage with our community.

This year we continued to use our very own independent membership payment portal as well as an online store. This gives our members the most direct approach to renewing and purchasing there membership whilst co existing with Surf Life Saving Australia's membership portal. The platform was designed for ease of use whilst significantly reducing administrational tasks for members of the board. The online store also allowed members to purchase apparel and carnival entries.

Significant infrastructure upgrades saw the club implement a multi vision surf cam which we continue to use and maintain allowing viewing from anywhere in the world for free. The cameras provide constant 24/7 monitoring of beach conditions as well as sponsorship opportunities for the upcoming season. A new CCTV system has also been installed around the club to provide better security for club craft and equipment.

Over the past three years our sponsorship program has played a vital role in ensuring that the club could stay financially sound. With the help of Alan Aulsebrook and John McNeil it has been a key focus to streamline the administrational duties surrounding this and to present a valuable offering to our supporters of the club. We are extremely grateful to the businesses and organisations who continue to come on board with the club and it is focus to continually strengthen and maintain these relationships going forward.

This season we also continued to produce our member engagement content series. Producing this content allows us to engage with our current and past members as well as the general public with a strong focus on giving them a feel of what the WSLSC is and what we do in the community. DIRECTOR - MEMBER AND LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

2022-2023 was another successful season in the MLD area. We began with the reinvigorated season launch which welcomed old and new members to herald in the new season and reconnect after the winter hiatus.

WSLSC is actively supporting our youth members to consider leadership opportunities in the future by nominating outstanding young members for LSV Leadership Development Camps. These opportunities give our youth the chance to engage with other clubs sharing knowledge and ideas and building networks not only along the surf coast but across Victoria. The board recognises the challenges faced by the rural and regional clubs and is committed to investing resources to enable our youth, to access learning and networking opportunities.

WSLSC now has an LSV Junior Advisory Committee Member in Bethany Ferguson with the hope of expanding the voice of our young people and building youth engagement, creating pathways and feeder groups across the club. The hope is that by enabling younger members to have a say in all aspects of club activities they will see themselves as custodians of our club and build leadership skills that will benefit the club and the community in future years.

As part of the LSV Membership and Leadership Development youth programs, we were able to support 8 of our youth members to attend camps and leadership days. William Ralston, Grace Corbett, and Claire Benson attended the 2023 Mike Martin Champion Junior Lifesaver Development Day, and Nellie Boyle, Jessica Renolds, Maya Furphy, and Tulli Wadling attended the U/13 LSV Leadership Camp. Nellie Boyle said that she, "really enjoyed the LSV camp, it was great fun and there was a broad range of different activities. I made lots of friends, and got to know people I've competed against in competitions. All the activities were fun and interactive and helped us grow our leadership skills". All camp participants returned with positive feedback on the program, friendships, and opportunities the camps offered. Grace Corbett participated in the U/15 Development Camp These opportunities have been shared at the club level to improve retention and expand participation.

This year we supported our Director of Junior Activities, Clint Joseph to attend the SLSA National Leaders' Masterclass in Adelaide. The program was an immersive experience of collaboration in leadership and strategic planning and we hope to see some of the learnings from the program implemented as part of our continuous improvement.

The Club gym continues to have increasing patronage, particularly during the off-season. Three induction sessions were held for new members with the support of Karen Benson. We thank all members for their support in maintaining the gym so it can continue to be a valued resource.

This year we witnessed our first female master's team in recent history compete at the Master State Championships with great success. This is exciting for the club and we hope this achievement will encourage other women to have a go and perhaps follow, Melody Jane, Lisa Wadling, Jacqui Eberbach, and Linda Said to take up the sport and represented our club.

Kristy Chiller was nominated this year for the LSV Women in Leadership IWD Recognition. This award recognises the amazing contribution of women such as Kristy who contribute across varied areas of our club and go above and beyond in their commitment to volunteerism.

Our second Blue Patrol / Men's Patrol initiative had an excellent turnout. Members actively participated in a discussion on all things blokey when it comes to health. While the club celebrates the importance of promoting women, they also acknowledge that at times men's health can be overlooked. This season the, Men's Patrol welcomed a guest speaker, endocrinologist, and the Clinical Director of general medicine at Southwest Heath with a special interest in men's health and wellbeing. The format of the presentation was along the lines of the TV series, "YOU CAN'T ASK THAT", and opened up an important conversation on issues of men's health.

Our Pink patrol was again well supported. The day saw a good turnout of our active female members, some of whom it was their first or second time in the red and yellow. It was great to see the young females of the club connecting and learning from women who have been patrolling for many years. The Pink Patrol acknowledges and celebrates the role of women in lifesaving. It is hoped that positive role modeling will inspire and empower future generations of women and girls to confidently pursue opportunities in lifesaving and aquatics. We hope to build on this event in the new season.

We again thank our Club's Child Safety & Wellbeing Officers: Kath Madigan and Ben Johnson for their contribution to supporting our membership throughout the season.

Our annual Awards Dinner concluded our season and was again well supported, representing all areas of our membership.

We have been well represented and successful with our Club Leaders being acknowledged as part of the South West sports assembly awards and the LSV Awards of Excellence this year. Club Captain Jo McDowall was the winner of the Women in Sports Leadership Award and our club was nominated as a finalist in the Sports Club of the Year. Club member Chris Hoffmann was also a finalist in the Coach/Official of the Year at the SWSA Awards. The LSV Awards of Excellence acknowledged, Mia Cook who was awarded, Open Athlete of the Year, and Chris Hoffmann who was awarded, Official of the Year. We are also proud to have been shortlisted for the Club of the Year.

During the off-season, we once again celebrated the Winter solstice. On a chilly Saturday evening, a large crowd of brave club members took the plunge returning to a warm fire and wonderful social catch-up. This event highlights the sense of community and comradery that is our club.

Upon reflection, we had a great season for M&LD I want to thank everyone for their involvement or encouragement for these programs and events as the development and engagement of our members are as important to our club as patrols, sports, or training. Looking towards the future, we want to continue to grow our emerging leaders, we will continue to develop connections and celebrate the extraordinarily knowledgeable, generous, and valued members that we have by building on our existing programs.

DIRECTOR - SURF SPORTS

Surf sports training resumed in August 2022 under Head Coach Steven Kerr. Steven had oversight of the Club program and was predominantly aligned with the general fitness program and board paddling. Our ski paddling numbers again increased this season and were under the expert coaching of Jackson Fary and Ben Johnson with an occasional cameo role from Rodney Owen that really helped our novice and seasoned paddlers alike. The Club and our athletes owe a big thank you to these designated and co-opted coaches and for those senior paddlers; John Hart, Paddy O'Brien and Harry McNamara that also lead the groups at various times.

In the pre-season the competition squad spent two nights in Port Fairy at a training camp which certainly pushed their endurance capacity and brought the team together to set some standards. Training took place in and around Port Fairy and Tower Hill, this was made possible through the assistance of our coaches and parents that pitched in providing meals and logistical support.

The first real hit out of serious competition was the Victorian Endurance Championships held at Cosy Corner, Torquay in October, 2022. The Club had Rory Fawcett win the Under 15 Female Board 4km, Jackson Fary win the Open Male 10km Ski, Mia Cook win the Under 17 Female 6km Ski and Under 17 Female Board 4km. Interestingly Jackson was in the lead at the end of the first lap of the course and inadvertently went to the starting buoy making his win a bit sweeter due to the extra distance he put in his race!

The Club attended the annual Jim Wall event in Torquay in January which was made part of the Summer of Surf series, once again the Torquay crew put on a great day of racing. In a first for Warrnambool we had an Open Female Iron champion in Mia Cook. Mia also took out the Open Female Board, Under 17 Female Board and Ski races.

The Victorian Super Surf Teams League and Victorian State teams competed at Maroubra Beach, Sydney from January 13 to 16, 2023 with Warrnambool being represented by Mia Cook in both.

Once again the Surf Sports athletes travelled to Sydney to compete at the Manly and Freshwater Carnivals and were hosted by the North Steyne Surf Life Saving Club. Without this support from our friends on the Northern Beaches the competitors would be responsible for their own accommodation and also miss the history and the team building environment that such an experience brings; our huge thanks go to the Committee and Members at North Steyne.

On January 28, 2023 the Club hosted the Battle of the Bay in conjunction with the Summer of Surf team. Martin O'Brien was the key coordinator for this event from the WSLSC and his efforts along with many other club members is greatly appreciated. A great day of racing was held in super conditions with many of our members having podium finishes including Georgia Ierodiaconou winning the Under 15 Female Board final and Rory Fawcett coming in second in this race too. The U17 Female Ski and Board, Open Female Board and Open Iron Woman finals were all won by Mia Cook. Coach Steve Kerr also won the Open Mens Board final on our own beach, some great results that all contributed to points in the Summer of Surf to these individuals.

Ocean Grove Surf Life Saving Club hosted the Victorian State Championships in February and the club was well represented with 40 competitors trying their utmost in reasonable conditions. Both Beach and Surf athletes acquitted themselves very well with the team bringing home a total of 30 medals. See the appendix for the complete list of medal winners at States.

The final event of the season, The Aussies, was held at Scarborough Beach Perth from March 25 to April 2. WSLSC had 11 members journey across the country to compete, 5 Masters, 3 Youth and 3 Open competitors all raced against the best in the country with some transferring their competition rights to other clubs so they could race in teams events which is an unique factor of the sport. Of the group Mia Cook placed third in the Individual Under 17 Female Board Final and also in the Under 17 Female Board Relay Final; this effort of 2 Bronze Medals was just rewards after the training and the results of her surf sports season.

The final celebration of the surf sports season took place at the annual LSV Awards for Excellence with Mia Cook taking out the Open Athlete of the Year category.

I would like to acknowledge that the racing season and our obligations at carnivals does draw on a considerable number of people within the Club; to get the race craft to the venue, to drive and crew IRB's, to officiate and coach the teams on the beach is something we need to keep developing our resources in. Special thanks to the Board of Management who have shown great support to the athletes this season.

DIRECTOR - TRAINING

Introduction:

Training for life-saving is a critical aspect of emergency response and preparedness. It is essential to equip individuals with the necessary skills to respond effectively in emergency situations, where time is often a crucial factor. This report aims to outline the key elements of training for life-saving.

Importance of Training for Life-Saving:

Effective life-saving training is essential for the following reasons:

Saves Lives: The primary goal of life-saving training is to equip individuals with the necessary skills to save lives in emergency situations. The knowledge and skills gained from such training can mean the difference between life and death.

It was great to see members gain their advanced awards which in turn helps at patrol, as we need these advanced awards in addition to the Bronze medallion to conduct patrols.

This season, LSV successfully introduced the new Silver Medallion Patrol Captain. Two members travelled to LSV for a two day course where hopefully we can role this out next year. The new Silver Medallion Patrol Captain (SMPC) Award has been developed and released to help better prepare Club Patrol Captains of the future.

The course has been reviewed and refined and now incorporates a blended learning approach and features embedded scenarios that surf lifesavers may face whilst on patrol.

Skills Maintenance:

This year skills maintenance reverted back to its original format with an emphasis on online content and demonstrations. Participants this year were back demonstrating all components of CPR.

Skills Maintenance this year saw us conduct two main individual skills maintenance sessions, with 8 sessions in total with 4 of these including Advanced Resuscitation Techniques. This saw over 200 members enhance their skills in all aspects of Life Saving. We were able to cover different components for the season with information about membership renewal, new club board members, how patrols would run and patrol rosters and the main reason to refresh skills. A very big thankyou to the Port Fairy Life Saving Club for the use of their facilities, due to the water quality of the Warrnambool Beach from the overflow of the rivers from the recent floods.


